Description of Program

The PJU program has been designed in consultation with experienced Early Childhood Educators, Teachers, Directors and Administrators to meet the needs of the whole child academic, enrichment, creativity, and virtues. Our aim to provide a program that enhances a child's learning experiences through play and exploring their environment.

The PJU "hands-on" program offers a balance of structured and unstructured activities. Your Precious Jewel will have an opportunity enhance social skills; participate in dramatic play; create artistic expression; learn about health and nutrition; celebrate in circle time, sing melodious music; fall in love with reading in the library, tend to the PJU vegetable garden; explore in the butterfly garden, and become socially sociable with indoor and outdoor play.

The PJU program places a focus on early literacy, numeracy and science skills to reinforce what is being taught week over week. Each lesson provides a scope and sequence to build upon what was learned the week before.

Staff

The PJU Child Care Professional is one of Early Childhood Educator licensed or Educational degree; five or more years of experience, and has a natural love for children. PJU goes through extensive pre-employment assessments, background and criminal history research, and CPR and First Aid certification. PJU believes that education is a lifetime learning process, and is involved in on-going professional academic development through academic training, seminars, workshops, and yearly Early Childhood convocations. Pick up Policy Arrival and Departure

Your child's safety is our main concern. Parent must bring their Precious Jewel to the classroom and sign in. Children must be picked up promptly at the end of class and signed out. If your child is part of the After School Care program, they will stay in the room while the other children arrive after school. (Please note that if your child is not part of the After School Care program you must pick up your child outside of the classroom door at 2:30).

Parents are asked to inform PJU by 9:00 a.m. if your Precious Jewel will not be attending for the day. Please notify the PJU if someone other than yourself or a designated person is picking up your child.

WE WILL NOT RELEASE YOUR CHILD TO ANYONE UNLESS WE ARE PROPERLY INFORMED BY YOU IN WRITING.

Please call 770 819-9435 to inform us of any changes.

PJLI will email an "Authorization for Pick Up" form for you to update the information and email or fax back to us.

Late Fees: We understand that parents can be unavoidably detained occasionally. If you are going to be late picking up your child please inform the center by phone so we can reassure your child that you are on your way. Please be

aware that starting at 7:05 p.m. Non-Thurs, late fees will be charged, on Fri late starting at 6:35 p.m. The fee is per child, and will apply each minute at a rate of 1.00 per minute. These charges are due in full the same day incurred. No exceptions. Thank you.

Health and Safety

Please keep your child at home if any of these symptoms are present:

- * Rash
- Vomiting
- * Diarrhea
- * Severe runny nose that is not clear
- * Severe coughing
- * Head lice or nits
- Communicable illness

Any contagious or communicable diseases require notification to the Public Health Department. If your child comes into contact with or contracts a contagious or communicable disease please contact us immediately. If your child becomes ill at PJU we will make your child as comfortable as possible. Parents will be contacted and are expected to pick up their child from the center as soon as possible.

Nedication

Staff can only administer prescription medication if the medicine comes in the original container, clearly marked with the current date and dosage on the label. An "administering of medication" form must be filled out and signed by the parent. The staff member who gives the medicine to your child will initial this form. Non-prescription medication i.e. Tylenol WILL NOT be given to your child without a doctor's note stating reason, amount and time.

Guidance and Discipline Philosophy

We believe that discipline should be done in a gentle manner to encourage direction, and to gain a valuable lesson, while maintaining the child's sense of self-worth. We recognize that children are unique and special and that they have specific needs and considerations. The goal is for our Precious Jewels to be taught virtues to become self-disciplined so that they are aware of how to handle different emotions and situations.

Strategies PJU uses:

A variety of strategies are used to help guide children's behavior. A strategy will be effective in some situations and with some children but may not be effective at another time.

Each child and situation is different so different strategies may be used. The following strategies will be used to promote positive interactions among children and adults at PJU:

- 1. We set clear and consistent limits by explaining what is expected of each child. We take the time to explain why a behavior is expected and we speak slowly and clearly using a calm, friendly tone.
- 2. We reinforce appropriate behavior with both words and gestures. It is important to acknowledge positive behavior. This helps to encourage the child to repeat the behavior.
- 3. We redirect or divert children when appropriate. This means having the child is redirected to another activity or area.

- 4. We offer simple reminders to children about the limits and expectations. Children will often become distracted during play activities and will need to be reminded of appropriate behavior patterns.
- 5. We encourage the children to use problem solving strategies or techniques. This helps to build their self-esteem and communications skills.
- 6. We invite children to verbalize their feelings and their needs at all times. This creates a sense of trust.
- 7. We provide children with appropriate choices for their behavior. This gives them the opportunity to make decisions. e.g., "Would you like to wait here for your turn to paint a picture or would you like to play somewhere else and I will call you when it is your turn?"
- 8. We help the children with natural and logical consequences so they can understand the outcomes of their behavior. E.g. "When a cup is placed on the edge of the counter, it will fall and spill the water." "Here is a sponge to wipe it up."
- 9. We do not use corporal punishment (spanking, hitting, shaking, and deprivation of meals or snacks) as a form of punishment at PJU.

Confidentiality

PJU realizes the importance of our client's right to privacy, and affirms that assured all information and any matters concerning your child will be kept confidential. Please be aware, however, that we are legally required to report any suspected child abuse or nealect to the proper authorities.

Lunch and Snacks

PJU will provide a nutrition breakfast, lunch, and two health snacks per day. Wenus are distributed and posted on a quarterly basis. Parents are responsible for supplementing special dietary needs. Please list any foods, allergies, religious preferences or concerns in your file for our reference.

Clothing

Children enjoy actively exploring their world around them. Therefore, we ask that the children wear comfortable, washable and manageable play clothes each day. Also, please be aware that we go outside whenever possible. It is important that your child is suitably dressed for outside play each day. Please mark everything with your child's name. For safety reasons, we request that children have a pair of non-slip shoes to wear at PJU, and that long strings on clothing be removed as they can be dangerous on climbing equipment.

Field Trips

Field trips offer a fun, exciting learning experience for young children. You Precious Jewel will have an opportunity to join the children in the Before and After school program to participate in a variety of outings on Professional Days, Spring Breaks, Summer Breaks, and Holidays. Parents are asked to sign up their child for these days in advance and there is an additional fee based upon the excursion. Please check the calendar online.

School Closures

As we are all aware, we tend to get a few good snowfalls each year that make the roads unsafe to travel. Our general policy is if the Cobb County Schools are close, we are closed also. If PJU staff members cannot safely make it to the school, then we will have to close the program for that day. The teacher will keep an up-dated class list at home to personally call each family to inform them of any school closures.

In the event of a power outage, our policy is to call Georgia Power to see if they have an estimated time for the power to be reinstated. If the power will be on within two hours we will continue with the program. If the power is estimated to be out longer than two hours or we cannot get confirmation from Georgia Power, we will contact all families to come and pick up their child.

This is a PJU policy.

Early Dismissal

There are a few early dismissals each year (2-3) that will affect the part time PJU parents and children only. On these particular days, part time PJU parents will have to pick up their children at the early dismissal school time (usually 1:30), instead of usual school pick up time being 2:30. Thank you.

Emergency Procedures

The staff at PJU is aware of and trained in emergency procedures, and is required to practice fire drills and emergency evacuation on a regular basis. To help the children understand the importance of emergency procedures, one of our first focus themes in October is on fire and safety. We feel it is important to practice Tornado and Hurricane Drills with the children. We also teach your Precious Jewels the importance of practicing these procedures at home; we encourage you to take time to plan and practice emergency procedures with your family.
